**CATTLE IDENTIFICATION EXEMPTION NOTICE 2007
BULLS BORN BEFORE JULY 2003**

Made by the Chief Inspector of Stock under Regulation 84B(2)(c).

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the Cattle Identification Exemption Notice 2007 – Bulls born before July 2003.

2. Revocation

On coming into operation, this notice revokes Cattle Identification Exemption Notice 2005 – Bulls born before July 2003.

3. Duration

The notice comes into operation on 1 July 2007 and remains in effect until otherwise revoked or varied by means of a further notice.

4. Cattle identification exemption for bulls born before July 2003.

Bulls born before July 2003 are exempt from the requirements of regulation 84B (1) subject to the following conditions being met:

1. Each lot of such bulls is moved from a property only and directly to the lairage of an abattoir, a saleyard, or an export depot.
2. No lot of bulls is moved to an abattoir, saleyard or export depot unless prior to the movement, the owner of the destination abattoir, saleyard or export depot has given to the owner of the cattle at the place of origin, agreement to the movement.
3. If the bulls are being moved to an abattoir or a saleyard, each bull is identified with:
 - (i) a tail tag bearing the Property Identification Code (PIC) identifying the owner and the property from which the bulls are being moved; and
 - (ii) a paint brand.
4. If the bulls are being moved to an export depot, each bull is identified with an ear tag bearing the Property Identification Code (PIC) identifying the owner and the property from which the cattle are being moved.
5. Each lot of bulls is at all times kept separate from all other cattle.
6. Each lot of bulls is accompanied by a separate waybill or waybill/National Vendor Declaration (NVD).
7. If at a saleyard, the bulls are offered for sale, and are sold, only for movement direct to the lairage of an abattoir for slaughter, and are moved directly to the lairage of an abattoir.
