Keep fruit fly out of Kununurra

One of the most productive agricultural regions in Australia, the Ord River Irrigation Area (ORIA) near Kununurra, is free from both the Mediterranean and Queensland fruit fly species. These high impact pests affect fruit and vegetable production in other parts of Australia. The maggots of these flies develop inside seemingly undamaged fruit and cannot easily be detected.

Mediterranean fruit fly is present in Western Australia from Broome southwards but it must be prevented from reaching the Kimberley region where the ORIA is located. Queensland fruit fly is not present in Western Australia

Whether you are arriving from the eastern States via Kununurra or travelling north in Western Australia, avoid carrying fresh fruit into this area. From 1 April to 30 November uncertified citrus and stone fruit are prohibited, but any type of fruit may harbour quarantine pests at any time of year.
