Keep Australia foot-and-mouth disease free

What is foot-and-mouth disease?

Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) is a highly contagious animal disease that affects all cloven-hoofed animals including cattle, sheep and pigs.

An outbreak would cause sickness in animals and greatly impact Australia's meat and dairy farmers.

Make sure you don't bring FMD with you to Australia.



How do I stop the spread of foot-and-mouth disease?

DON'T BRING MEAT AND DAIRY PRODUCTS TO AUSTRALIA



CLEAN AND DECLARE

all shoes, clothing and equipment used near animals or in rural areas



Declare and present any risk goods to a biosecurity officer for inspection on arrival in Australia or put it in a bin.

Penalties of up to **\$2,664** apply for breaching Australia's biosecurity laws. Your visa may also be cancelled.
