### COVID 19

The COVID 19 pandemic, has affected most sectors including DPIRD and the member organisations of the CAWE. Many of the preparedness projects for animal welfare in emergencies were postponed during this time including the review of the first Natural Hazard Season with the approved State Support Plan – Animal Welfare in Emergencies.

The May meeting of the CAWE was an opportunity for member organisations to reconnect and advise on any ongoing issues being faced. Minimal animal welfare concerns were raised however, it was noted that had COVID-19 restrictions continued, there was potential of welfare impacts for a significant number of animals such as those involved in the racing industry.

Industries and businesses that have animals are encouraged to forward plan for how they will maintain their animals' welfare in the event of income loss or sustained closure.
