

Site plan requirements

A site plan is an aerial or satellite image that depicts the proposed on-ground activities.

Site plans need to include a key / legend that identifies the proposed on-ground activities.

- Site plan needs to be at a readily interpretable scale that can be readily understood by assessors
- Site plan identifies the proposed carbon estimation area(s). If you have **more than one CEA**, please **number them on your site plan**. The Clean Energy Regulator (CER) provides further definition on CEAs [here](#). The CER has requirements on the mapping of CEAs that can be found [here](#). Please consult your relevant Service Provider with help mapping CEAs if required.
- You can use the program of your choice to develop your site plan
- If there is more than one property involved, provide a site plan for each property.

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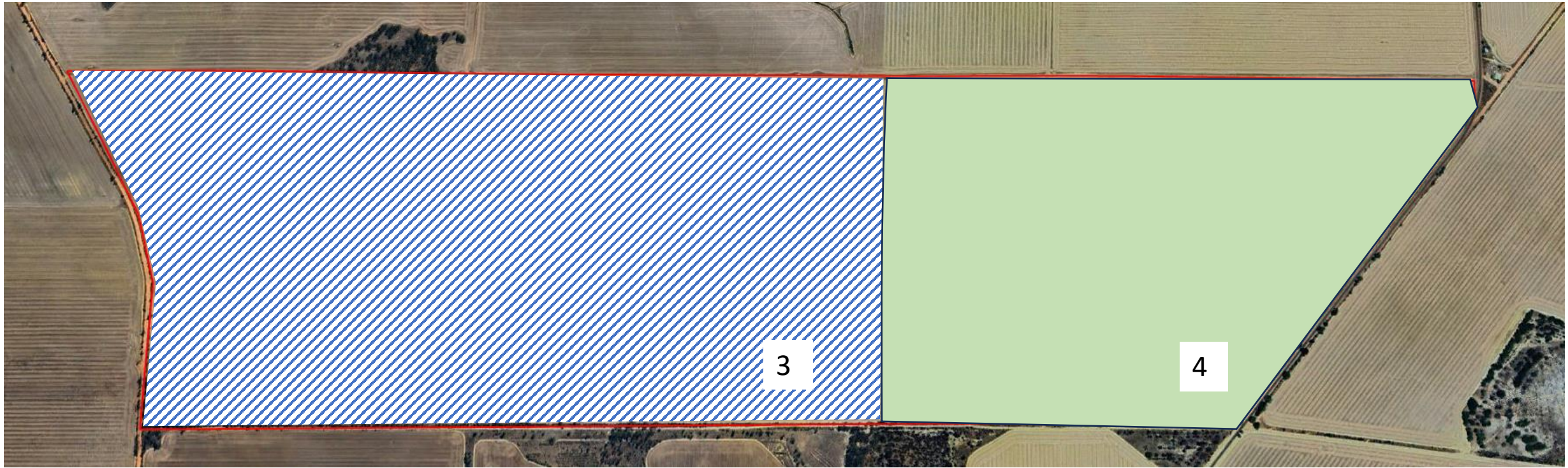


Environmental planting Legend
