50km Quarantine Areas  
have been declared around  
Kununurra and Wyndham.

Within the Quarantine Areas are  
designated Control Areas and  
Restricted Areas.

### Permitted:

Only citrus retailers from outside the  
Quarantine Area can supply citrus fruit and  
juice into the Restricted Area for human  
consumption.

**You can not take any citrus fruit or  
plants outside the Quarantine Areas.**

### We need your cooperation

Restrictions on the movement of citrus  
plants and fruit are for the benefit of Western  
Australia's citrus industry — **with your  
assistance, we can support WA citrus  
growers to minimise the impact on their  
businesses.**

We realise the restrictions may cause some  
inconvenience, but your cooperation will  
help stop the spread of citrus canker in  
Western Australia.

I am a **commercial grower**  
located in the Control Area

**What I can do**

You can move citrus fruit, juice, machinery and host material within the Control Area.

You can transport citrus fruit, out of the Quarantine Area if an authorised inspection has occurred and a Plant Health certificate issued.

**What I can't do**

You **can't** move/transport citrus fruit, leaves or plants **into** the Restricted Area.

You **can't** take fruit, leaves, plants or host material **out** of the Control Area:

- Citrus plants and leaves
- machinery that has been in contact with citrus plants
- equipment or growing media that have been in contact with citrus plants.



I am a **retail business**  
located in the Control Area

**What I can do**

You can import and sell citrus fruit and juice that is grown outside of the Quarantine Area.

You can buy and sell fruit and juice grown within the control area.

You can move citrus fruit and juice, within the control area.

**What I can't do**

You **can't** supply citrus fruit, leaves or plants to businesses located within the restricted area.

You **can't** take fruit, leaves, plants or host material **out** of the Control Area:

- Citrus plants and leaves
- machinery that has been in contact with citrus plants
- equipment or growing media that have been in contact with citrus plants.



I am a **resident**  
located in the Control Area

**What I can do**

You can still buy citrus fruit and juice at your local supermarket.

You can buy locally grown citrus fruit and leaves from farmer's markets/roadside stalls.

You can share home grown citrus fruit and leaves with neighbours and friends.

**What I can't do**

You **can't** take any citrus fruit or leaves **into** the Restricted Area.

You **can't** take locally grown fruit **out** of the Restricted Area.

You **can't** take citrus fruit, leaves and plants **out** of the Quarantine Area.

Locally grown fruit can not be moved out or within the Restricted Area.
