What you need to know about European wasps

European wasp is a **social**, **environmental and agricultural** declared pest, due to its aggressive, scavenging and predatory behaviour.

European wasps are attracted to human and pet food, and have a profound negative impact on



pollination, honeybees, native invertebrates, people's health (they are highly aggressive), horticulture, the environment, and can disrupt outdoor dining and food-based recreational activities.

Public reports play a vital role in our surveillance efforts

You can identify European wasps through their distinctive characteristics, that are different from other wasps.

- Black antennae
- Feeding on human food and drinks, and pet food (protein)
- Flying in and out of a single hole in the ground (90% of nests are underground)
- · Short and raised legs during flight
- Flying very fast with no hovering
- Bee-like shape and approximately 15mm long
