The Minister for Agriculture and Food, on behalf of the Western Australian Government, offered 24 grants for not-for-profit activities that improve the welfare of companion animals and wildlife in WA in Round 2 of the Animal Welfare Grant Program. Shire of Kojonup	Refurbishment of an existing building to be utilised as a cat holding facility	Great Southern	\$13,725
West Coast Maremma and Livestock Guardian Rescue	Refurbishment of an existing shed to set up as a food preparation area for rescued dogs.	Wheatbelt	\$4,985
